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Audience

This book is intended for anyone who installs, manages, and configures a Cisco 6200 advanced digital subscriber line access multiplexer (DSLAM).

Document Organization

This book provides task-based instructions for installing and using the Cisco 6200 Manager to configure, manage, and monitor a Cisco 6200 DSLAM.

The manual is organized as follows:

- Chapter 1, “Cisco 6200 Manager Overview,” describes the Cisco 6200 Java-based element management application that you can use to configure and manage the Cisco 6200 DSLAM.
- Chapter 2, “Getting Started,” contains platform and system requirements and provides instructions for installing the Cisco 6200 Manager application.

- Chapter 3, “Managing the Manager,” tells how to start and administer the Cisco 6200 Manager as well as use its help system.
- Chapter 4, “Configuring with the Manager,” provides information about using the Cisco 6200 Manager to configure the Cisco 6200 DSLAM.
- Chapter 5, “Monitoring and Testing,” explains how to use the Cisco 6200 Manager to check the status of the Cisco 6200 DSLAM, its cards, and its ports. The chapter also includes procedures for testing lines.
- Appendix A, “Glossary,” defines some of the terms and acronyms mentioned in this book.
